

JEWISH FOUNDATION FOR EDUCATION OF WOMEN ÉMIGRÉS IN THE HEALTH SCIENCES SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM GUIDELINES

1. The Jewish Foundation for Education of Women provides scholarships to émigré women with significant economic need studying in the health sciences.
The program provides scholarships for émigrés from the former Soviet Union to train in medicine, dentistry, dental hygiene, nursing, pharmacy, occupational and physical therapy, physician assistant programs, Sonography, and cardiovascular technology programs. Students must already be enrolled or about to be enrolled in one of these programs to be eligible. Students studying speech pathology are not eligible for this award.
2. Applicants must be legal **permanent** residents of the United States. International students visiting the United States with F, B, M, J, or other visas are not eligible for this award.
3. Applicants must be Jewish residents of either New York City or the counties of Nassau, Suffolk and Westchester (the “New York Metropolitan Area”). Please note that returning students not originally residents of the New York Metropolitan Area who have registered to vote in the New York Metropolitan Area are deemed to be New York Metropolitan Area residents for purposes of applying for this scholarship.
4. Applicants must be students at colleges or graduate or professional schools located in the New York Metropolitan Area and must be physically in attendance at New York Metropolitan Area campuses. Students who are studying abroad or at satellite campuses or who are completing internships outside of the New York Metropolitan Area are not eligible to apply.
5. Scholarships will be awarded for a maximum of \$5,000. **Scholarships are not automatically renewed.** However, those already receiving a JFEW Émigrés in the Health Sciences Scholarship will automatically be sent a renewal application.
6. All scholarship decisions are final.
