

GUIDELINES FOR THE JEAN AND ALBERT NERKEN SCHOLARSHIP FUND

1. The Jean and Albert Nerken Scholarship Fund has been established at the United Jewish Appeal – Federation of Jewish Philanthropies of New York to provide financial assistance to needy Jewish individuals for secular studies only, in colleges, universities, graduate or professional schools.
2. Study must be at educational institutions of higher learning approved by UJA-Federation.
3. Applicants may be U.S. citizens, permanent legal residents of the U.S., or international students studying in the United States. International students must fill their address at their home country as their permanent address.
4. Students must be either NY Metro area residents studying outside of the NY Metro area or Non-NY Metro area residents studying in the NY Metro area.
5. Applicants, who are over 18 and U.S citizens, must be registered to vote.
6. Each student selected will receive up to \$5,000 annually for up to four years of his or her education. A commitment to each student will be limited to one year at a time, and **students must re-apply each year for consideration.**
7. Financial assistance shall not be provided for religious studies, or to students who are receiving full tuition waivers. Furthermore, no student may receive more than one scholarship per year from the various Funds established at UJA-Federation (e.g. Jean and Albert Nerken Scholarship Fund, Rose Biller Endowment Fund, Selim and Rachel Benin Scholarship Fund)
